




WHERE ARE CHILDREN & YOUNG PEOPLE WITH ASD ATTENDING EDUCATION?

Of the 490 pupils with ASD, 325 attended Local Authority maintained mainstream or special schools. Of this, 304 were in Hackney maintained settings and 21 were in maintained settings outside Hackney. A further 56 pupils attended an Independent mainstream or special school, of which 23 were in Hackney and 33 in settings outside of Hackney.




NOTIONAL AVERAGE PLACEMENT COST (£) BY TYPE OF PLACEMENT



TREND OF STATEMENTS OF SEN AND EHC PLANS FOR ASD IN HACKNEY MAINTAINED SETTINGS




NUMBER OF EHC PLANS - ESTIMATE PROJECTIONS

WHAT DO WE MEAN BY AUTISTIC SPECTRUM DISORDER?

Autism is a lifelong developmental disability that affects how a person communicates with, and relates to, other people. It also affects how they make sense of the world around them.

Autism includes a spectrum of conditions, which means that while all people share certain difficulties, their condition will affect them in different ways. Some people with autism are able to live relatively independent lives but others may have accompanying learning disabilities and need a lifetime of specialist support. People with autism may also experience over- or under-sensitivity to sounds, touch, tastes, smells, light or colours.

The latest prevalence studies of autism indicate that 1.1% of the population in the UK may have autism.









NOTIONAL AVERAGE PLACEMENT COST (£) BY TYPE OF PLACEMENT




TREND OF STATEMENTS OF SEN AND EHC PLANS FOR SEMH IN HACKNEY MAINTAINED SETTINGS


NUMBER OF EHC PLANS - ESTIMATE PROJECTIONS

WHAT DO WE MEAN BY SOCIAL, EMOTIONAL AND MENTAL HEALTH?

SEMH is an overarching term for children who have severe difficulties in managing their emotions and behaviour.

SEMH difficulties as a need has three strands:

- 1. social and emotional well-being
- 2. mental health
- 3. behaviour management.

Children and young people with SEMH may experience difficulties with anxiety or depression; problems of conduct including aggression; self-harming, substance abuse, eating disorders or physical symptoms that are medically unexplained. Some children and young people may have other recognised disorders such as attention deficit disorder (ADD), attention deficit hyperactive disorder (ADHD), attachment disorder, autism or pervasive developmental disorder, a disruptive disorder or, rarely, schizophrenia or bipolar disorder.

Typical characteristics of children and young people with SEMH can include:

- · Disruptive, antisocial or uncooperative behaviour
- · Temper tantrums
- · Frustration, anger, and verbal and physical threats or aggression
- · Withdrawn and depressed attitudes
- · Anxiety and self-harm
- · Truancy
