

STOKE NEWINGTON COMMON

PLAY AREA IMPROVEMENTS

We are improving Stoke Newington Common play area. We are keeping the swings in place, adding some new equipment and making the landscape more playable. We would love to hear what you think.



- (A) The popular swings and see-saw are staying in place
- (B) Existing spinning wobble dish relocated
- (C) The existing slide is relocated to a new mound which is accessed by a balance rope and stepping logs
- (D) A couple of cows and a horse and cart for small children to climb on and pretend to be farmers
- (E) A large sand pit will provide a home to a collection of climbing logs and a play tower, which has a slide and multiple routes up it
- (F) Tree logs and boulders provide further spots to sit and ponder or climb and jump
- (G) The western boundary railing is replaced with a low gabion wall topped with seating. It will visually connect the play area with the rest of the common whilst providing enclosure
- (H) A new pathway links the play area's two entrances
- (I) A picnic bench is relocated to create a permanent home for the common's table tennis table
- (J) Benches
- (K) Trees and planting will provide shade and seasonal colour
