

Parking Zone R Review (Hackney Downs)

Consultation Outcome





Why have I received this summary booklet?

Parking Services consulted you between October and December 2018 to see whether the existing parking controls continued to meet local needs.

We would like to thank all those people who returned their questionnaire and provided feedback during the consultation. Your views are important to us and have helped shape the future of parking in your area.

We are pleased to announce that the consultation feedback has been reviewed and the final design has been approved by the Council.

This booklet provides a summary of the consultation results and final design of the parking restrictions that will be implemented in your area. It also provides dates of when works are likely to begin.

Parking Zone design changes

During the public consultation we sought your views on:

- The operational hours of parking controls in your zone
- Proposed boundary change for your zone
- Current parking design for your zone

Response Rate

Consultation packs were sent to 2335 households and businesses in the Zone R area. A total of 451 responses were received, which equates to a response rate of 19%. This is higher than the average response rate for a standard review consultation which is between 6–7%.

Consultation Feedback

Operational Hours

As part of the consultation, we asked your views on the current operational hours for your area to ensure that they still meet your needs. Residents and Businesses were given three hours of operation options to choose from:

- Option 1: Monday to Friday 7:00am to 11am (current hours of operation)
- Option 2: Monday to Friday 8:30am to 6:30pm
- Option 3: Monday to Saturday 8:30am 6:30pm

99% of respondents answered this question, with the majority (79%) being in favour of Option 1, **Monday to Friday 7:00am to 11am (current hours of operation).**

Based on the feedback received, we will be retaining the existing operational hours of Monday to Friday 7am to 11am in Zone R.

Parking boundary change

During the implementation of Zone R, Parking Services received feedback regarding the hours of operation from some roads requesting to be relocated into the nearby Zone S.

Based on the above feedback, Parking Services also consulted some residents and businesses on a proposed boundary change. During the consultation we proposed to relocate **Benthal Road** (section between Evering Road and Ottaway Street), Brooke Road (section between Evering Road and Rendelsham Road), Dunnock Mews, Ickburgh Road, Maury Road (between Evering Road and Rendelsham Road), Ottaway Street, Rendelsham Road and Stellman Close into nearby Zone S which has longer operational hours of Monday to Saturday 8.30am to 6.30pm.

Overall, the majority of the roads (7 out of 8 roads) were not in favour of the proposed boundary change, with the exception of Ickburgh Road where 59% of responses supported the relocation from Zone R to Zone S.

Based on the feedback received, Parking Services recommends only relocating **Ickburgh Road** from Zone R into Zone S and changing the operational hours in the road to **Monday to Saturday 8.30am to 6.30pm**.

Parking design

As part of the consultation, Parking Services asked resident and businesses in the area if they are happy with the current parking design (the layout and positioning of parking bays) for their parking zone.

Overall, the majority (79%) of the feedback was in favour of the current design for the zone.



What happens next?

May 2019

Statutory Consultation

Now the public consultation has been completed and recommendations have been approved, the Council is required to carry out a Statutory Consultation, where a Traffic Management Order notice is advertised in Hackney Today for a 21 day period. This process allows anyone to formally declare their representation on the changes proposed. All representations received will be considered. The Council is then required to draft a decision audit report detailing the objections and its recommendation on whether these objections will be upheld or not. The report is then approved by the Director of Public Realm prior to the measures being implemented.



The proposed Traffic Management Order will be advertised in Hackney Today on **13 May 2019** and the statutory consultation closing date will be **2 June 2019**. All feedback will need to be received by the Council by **Monday 2 June 2019**. Any feedback received after this date will not be considered.

Parking Restrictions Implemented

As the proposed changes do not include any lining works we expect all sign changes in Ickburgh Road to take place on **5 July 2019 (subject to the Traffic Order process)**. Stickers will be placed over signs to inform drivers of the change in restrictions which will commence from **8 July 2019**.

Please ensure you adhere to the signs from the date indicated above.

How will the Boundary change affect me?

Parking Permit and Vouchers

The boundary changes will only apply to Ickburgh Road and properties in the zone R section of Upper Clapton Road (between the junctions of Brooke Road and Ickburgh Road). See enclosed user friendly map for more details. From **8 July 2019** all existing Zone R ePermits belonging to residents and businesses in those sections will automatically be changed to Zone S e-Permits.

Residents and Businesses in Ickburgh Road and sections of Upper Clapton Road, with Zone R vouchers can continue to use their existing Zone R visitor voucher books until they run out.

Alternatively, Parking Services can replace any <u>full unused, undamaged books</u> of Zone R vouchers with Zone S visitor vouchers free of charge. Please return these vouchers, along with a cover letter containing your name and address to:

Any new visitor vouchers purchased after **8 July 2019** will be for Zone S.

Frequently Asked Questions

E-permits

The Council has now introduced e-permits which means that resident permits and companion badges are now electronic, so if you are applying for a new permit or renewing your permit, you will not receive or need to display a paper permit on your vehicle. An e-permit becomes active for your vehicle from the date you select in your application. Once the permit has been purchased, our enforcement officers can check if a vehicle has a valid permit by entering the vehicle registration number into their hand held devices.

Visitor vouchers will remain as paper permits until further notice and will continue to be delivered by courier.

There is also a postal application service for those who do not have access to the internet. Please contact parking services on **020 8356 8877** if you do not access to the internet and require a permit or vouchers.

How much does a parking permit cost?

The way we charge for parking has changed over the past three years as part of a drive to reduce pollution and improve air quality. The pricing of permits now reflect the level of vehicle emissions instead of engine size. This means that parking permits are cheaper for low emission vehicles and for more polluting vehicles the charges are higher. Other changes include:

- Cars built before 2001 will move up a band in the charging scheme, reflecting the levels of CO₂ they produce.
- Diesel vehicles will incur a £50 levy, which represents the high levels of particulate matter they produce.

The diesel supplement is £50 per year, and will be pro-rated for 3 and 6 month permits.

Visitor Permits

Residents are eligible to purchase visitor vouchers which allow visitors to park in any available resident permit, general permit (resident or business permits) or shared use (pay and display or permit) bay in the parking zone (PZ).

You only need to use a voucher during operational hours. There are two types of vouchers available for purchase by residents:

- A book of 20, 2hr scratch cards at a cost of £23
- A book of 5, one day scratch cards at a cost of £20

Businesses are also able to buy vouchers for their own vehicles and their visitors, which cost £225 for a book of 10 scratch cards which allow parking in all zones for one day. We also provide Pay & Display parking for business visitors wherever possible.

^{*}Where no information is held on a vehicle's CO_2 emissions, permit price will be calculated on engine size.

Where can I load and unload if I receive deliveries?

Active loading and unloading can take place on all single and double yellow lines where there are no loading restrictions and also in parking bays. For any specific requests, such as removals, you can request a dispensation or the suspension of a parking bay.

How can I apply for a disabled bay?

If you are a Blue Badge holder with no access to off street parking, you may be eligible for a disabled parking bay installed outside your home. However, in order to qualify for a bay, there is a set criteria which you need to meet including an assessment by Social Services.

Although a disabled parking bay is registered to an individual once installed, it can be used by any Blue Badge holder as the bay is not personalised.

What if I have a Blue Badge or a Companion Badge?

Blue Badge holders are eligible to park in all shared use bays (pay and display and permit) and pay and display only bays for an unlimited amount of time and on single and double yellow lines for a maximum of 3 hours, providing there are no loading restrictions in place and that the vehicle is not causing an obstruction. Blue Badge holders may also use any disabled bay.

Companion badge holders can park in the same bays as Blue Badge holders, but have the added advantage of being able to park in resident and permit parking bays within their home parking zone. For more information on Companion Badges please visit

What if I own a motorcycle?

Motorcycles may be parked free of charge in all bays within a PZ where residents and businesses can park. This excludes Zone B where motorcycle parking is restricted to motorcycle bays only and pay and display bays within all zones.

Motorcycles should be parked at a right angle to the kerb and, if possible at the end of the parking bay. Dedicated motorcycle bays should be used if available, rather than resident permit bays.

What if I live on a Car Free Property?

A Car Free Property will be designated under a car free restriction in a planning legal agreement, and should be included in your lease or deeds. If you live on a Car Free Property you are not eligible to purchase a parking permit. You are however, eligible to purchase visitor vouchers for your visitors.

Please ensure that you check the car free status of your property before applying for a permit. Information regarding the car free status of your property can be found in your lease or purchase contract.
