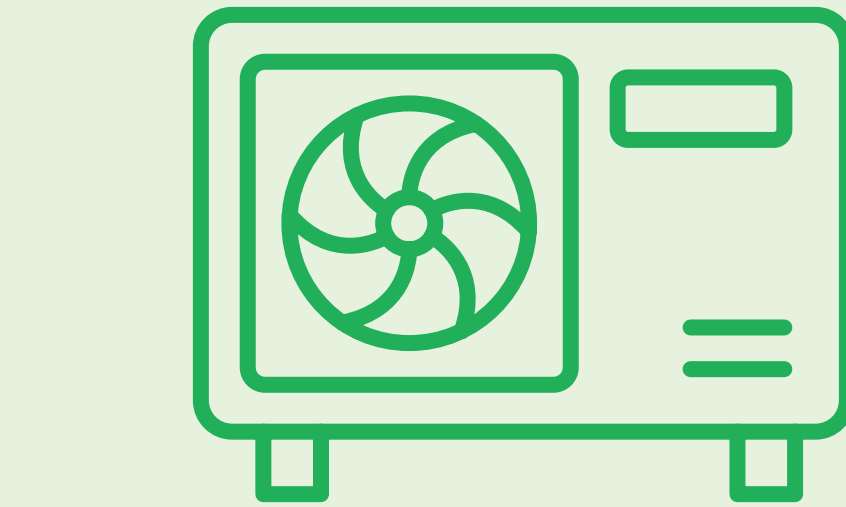


Council Climate Achievements 2023–2024



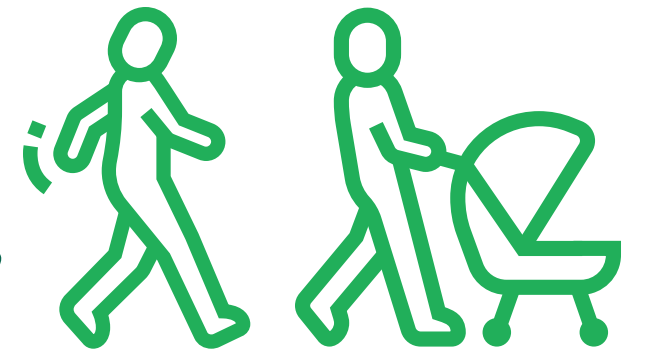
56 low-income private households, many facing significant vulnerabilities, had measures including **solar PV and LED lighting installed** in their homes via the Green Homes Grant programme



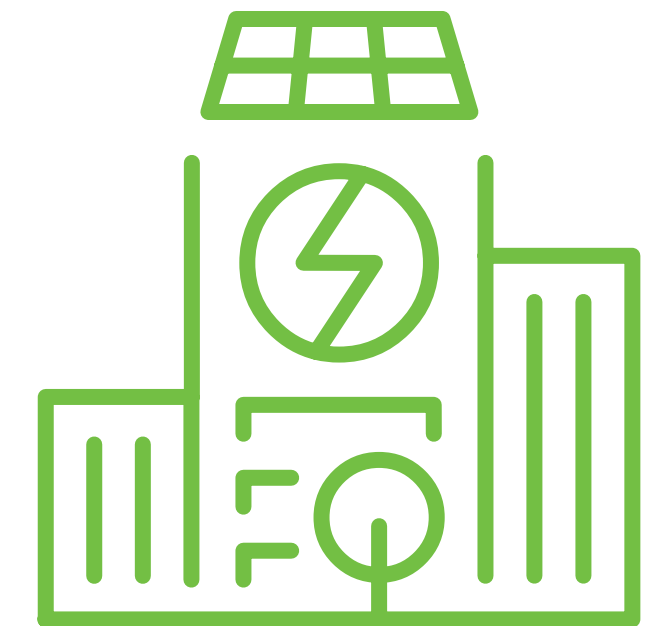
£13 million

from Public Sector Decarbonisation Fund awarded for **17 key Council buildings** – the largest funding allocation of any London local authority

Over 70% of eligible roads in Hackney covered by a low traffic zone, equating to **50% of the total area**, the highest in any London borough



32 local not-for-profit community organisations awarded a total of **£680,000** by Hackney Community Energy Fund – England’s largest local authority community energy fund – to install clean power/energy saving measures



Over 500 residents engaged in addressing extreme heat risks and protecting vulnerable groups, including **15 participants** in the Citizens’ Climate Jury



Over 160 emission-reducing measures have been undertaken through the Zero Emissions Network. The network has been **awarded £180,000** to support businesses’ transition to more sustainable transport



52 school streets currently in place in the borough



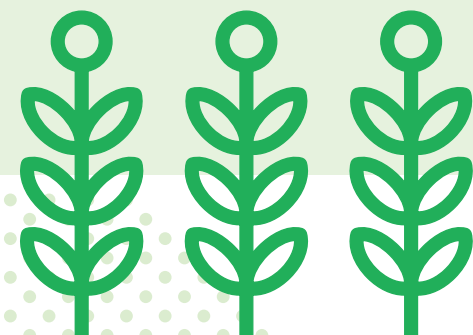
Over 200 bike hangers installed providing **1,200** new secure cycle storage spaces



11,000 lighting units replaced with energy-efficient LED technology, resulting in a **65% reduction in annual carbon emissions**

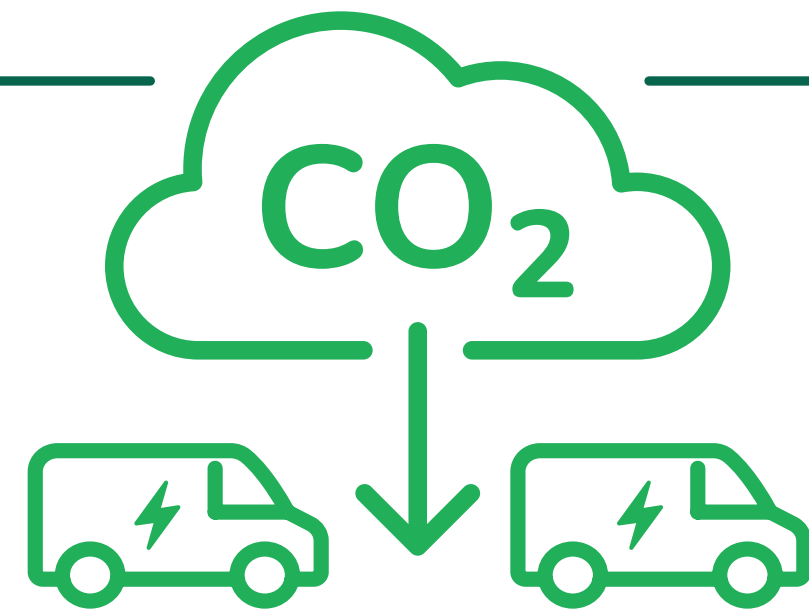


11 Sustainable Drainage Systems implemented in flood-prone areas – **approximately 2,600 sqm of surface run-off diverted** from the sewer system

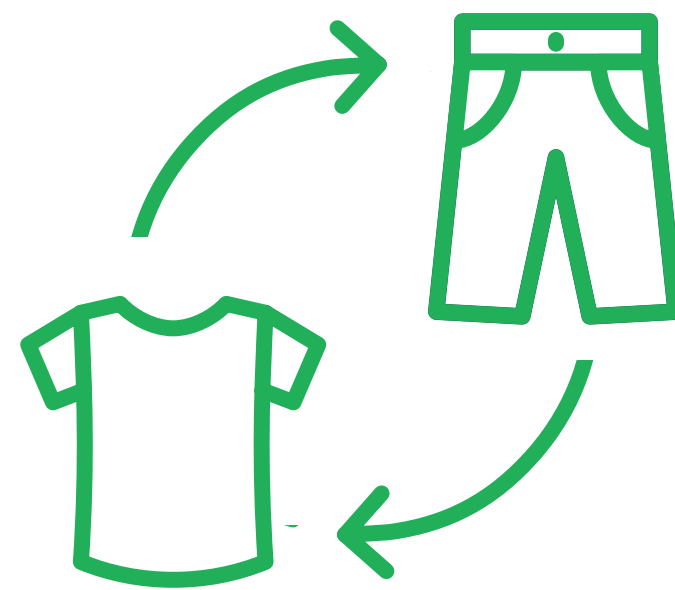


Council Climate Achievements 2023–2024

An estimated **77% carbon emission reduction** has been achieved across the Council's fleet



500,000 items reused through textile banks, clothes swaps, and exchange events in the Zero Waste Hackney programme



£600,000 raised from 467 investors – exceeding the original target – via the Hackney Community Municipal Investment to finance green initiatives in Hackney



Over **100,000 single-use plastic bags eliminated** from Hackney Markets in the six months since the Zero Plastics Markets project launched



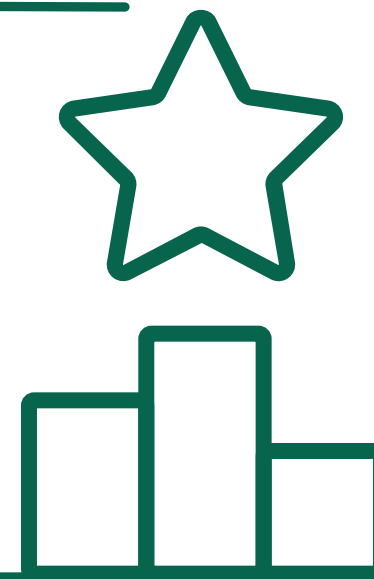
74 schools registered for the Eco School Programme engaging approximately **6,000 students** in various activities



10 schools installed green screens to help address air pollution impacts



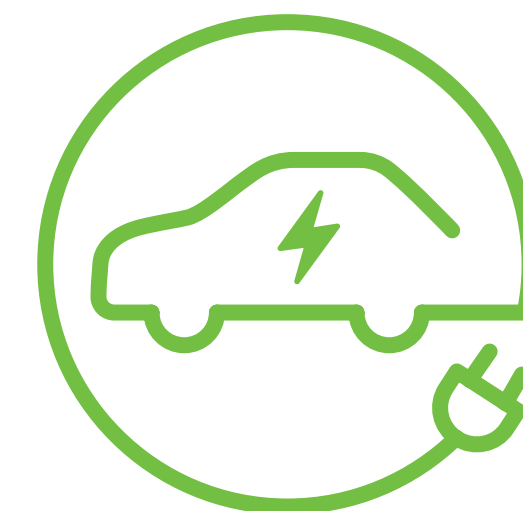
Council ranked **top-performer** in an independent assessment of London's parking policies in tackling climate change
