Why are we meeting?

Hackney Council is bringing forward an exciting updated proposal for the Marian Court development, delivering much-needed new homes and community facilities. There is an existing scheme which was granted planning permission in 2018. These revised proposals show the planning changes to that scheme.

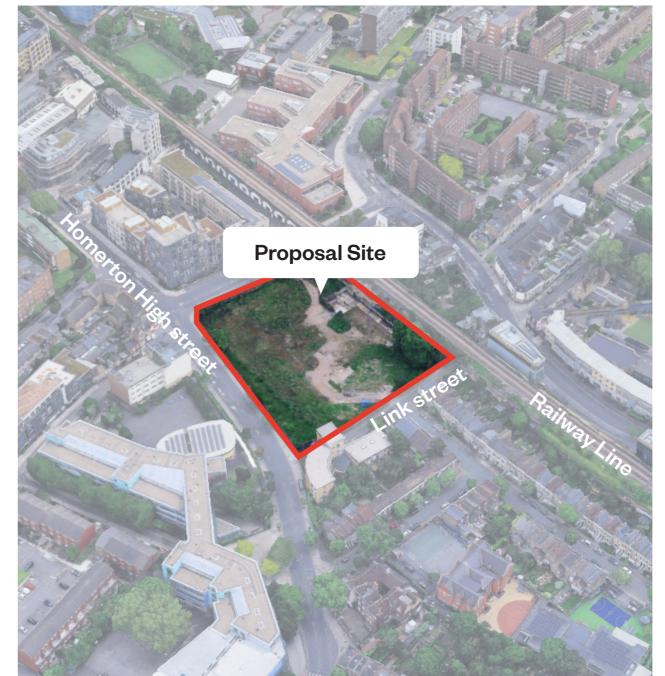
This exhibition is your opportunity as local residents and stakeholders to learn more about the updates, ask questions, and share your feedback. Please take a look at the information boards, speak to the team, and let us know what you think.

What are we proposing?

We are proposing a new residential development comprising 163 high-quality homes, designed to respond to local housing needs and contribute positively to the surrounding area. A new community centre, shops and workspaces will also serve the neighbourhood.

Key features of the proposals include:

- A mix of studio and 1, 2, 3 and 4-bedroom homes to suit a range of household types, all with their own private outdoor space
- Affordable housing provision: 36 Council homes for social rent, 61 for shared ownership and 66 for outright sale to help pay for the project
- Community centre of 187m²
- Four commercial units on Homerton High Street for retail, workspace or cafe use
- Sustainable design, including renewable energy sources and thermally efficient building fabric
- Improvements to landscaping and biodiversity, including new planting and green spaces
- Careful consideration of building height, scale, and appearance to fit within the local context



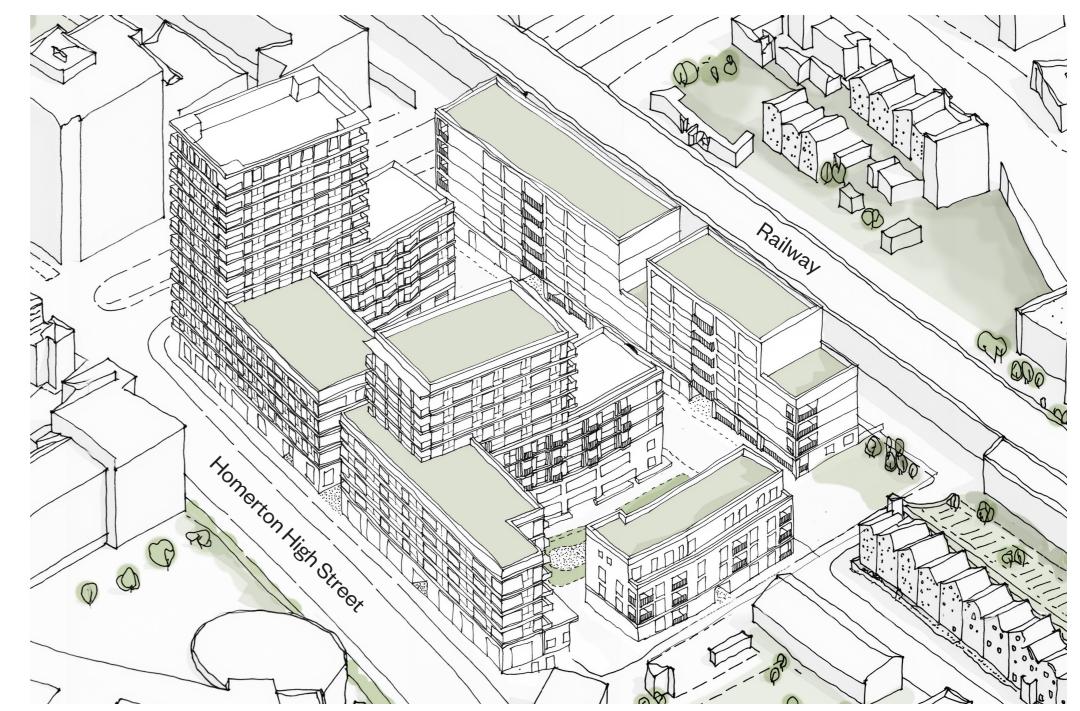

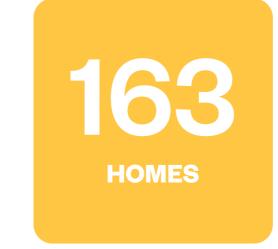

Consented scheme

Consented scheme overview

The Marian Court development was granted planning permission in June 2018.

The consented scheme proposed the demolition of all existing buildings and structures, and the construction of five new buildings ranging in height from 3 to 12 storeys. These would deliver 160 mixed-tenure homes, including replacement Council homes for social rent.

The consented scheme was designed by Adam Khan Architects and muf architecture/art.



Since planning permission was granted, substantial changes to building safety and fire regulations have made. In addition, construction costs have risen significantly due to factors such as Brexit, the COVID-19 pandemic and new fire safety regulations. It has therefore been necessary to revisit and amend the original scheme.

Retaining design principles

The revised proposals reflect the core principles of the consented scheme, retaining key design elements like active street frontages to Homerton High Street and Ponsford Street, public courtyards, and strong links to the surrounding area.

While some changes have been made to improve efficiency and meet updated regulations, the commitment to delivering high-quality homes for Hackney and a welcoming neighbourhood remains unchanged.

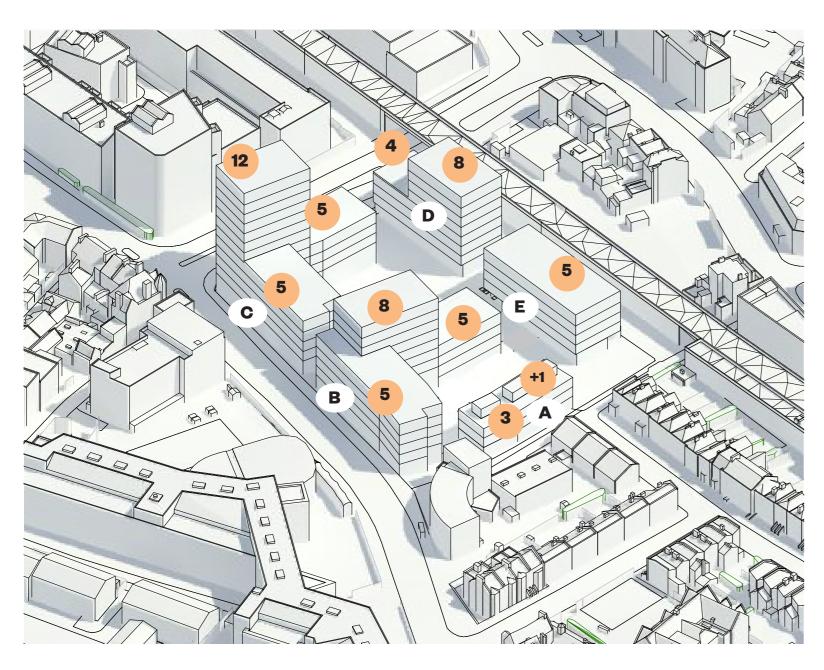

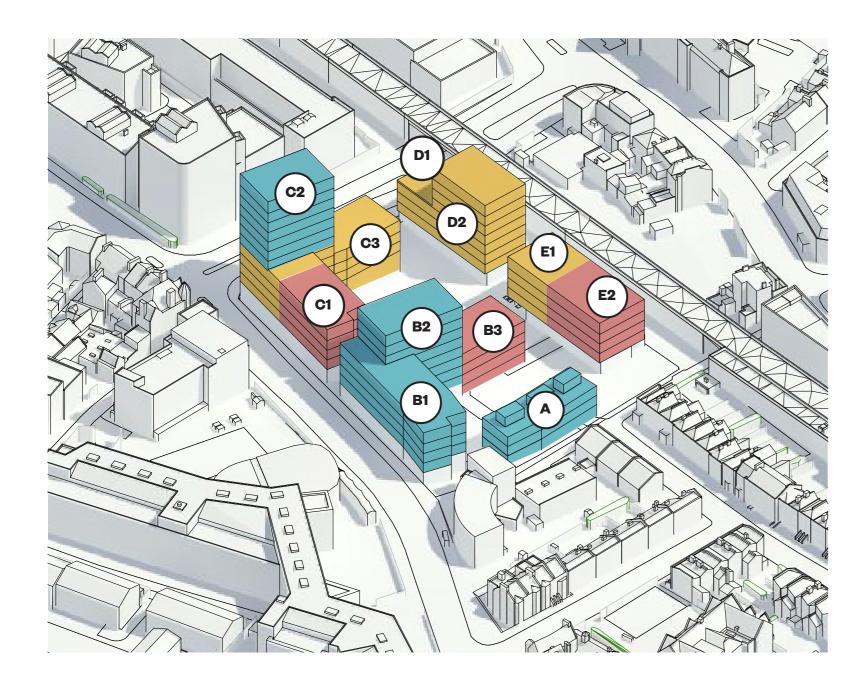

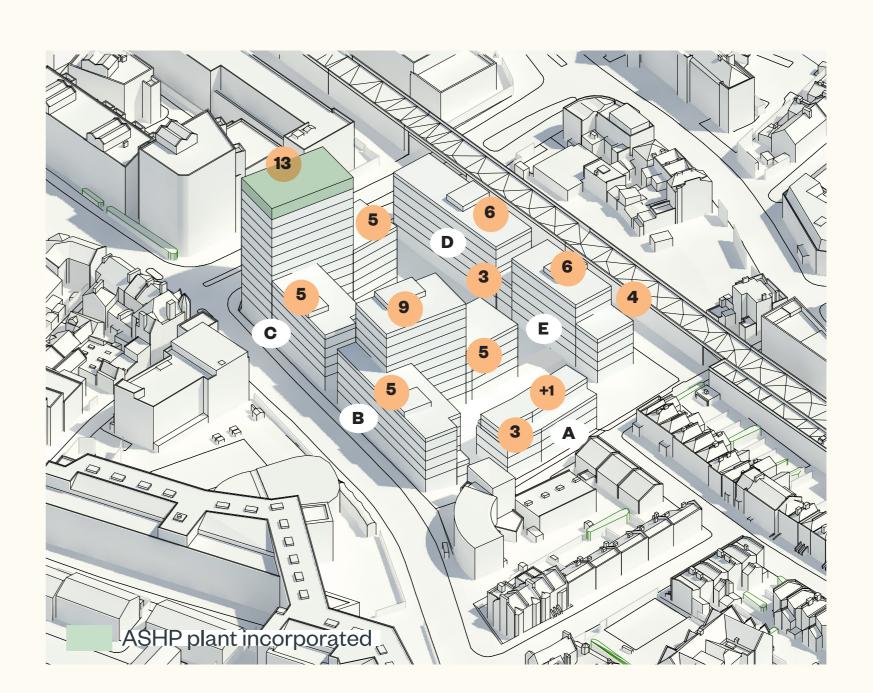

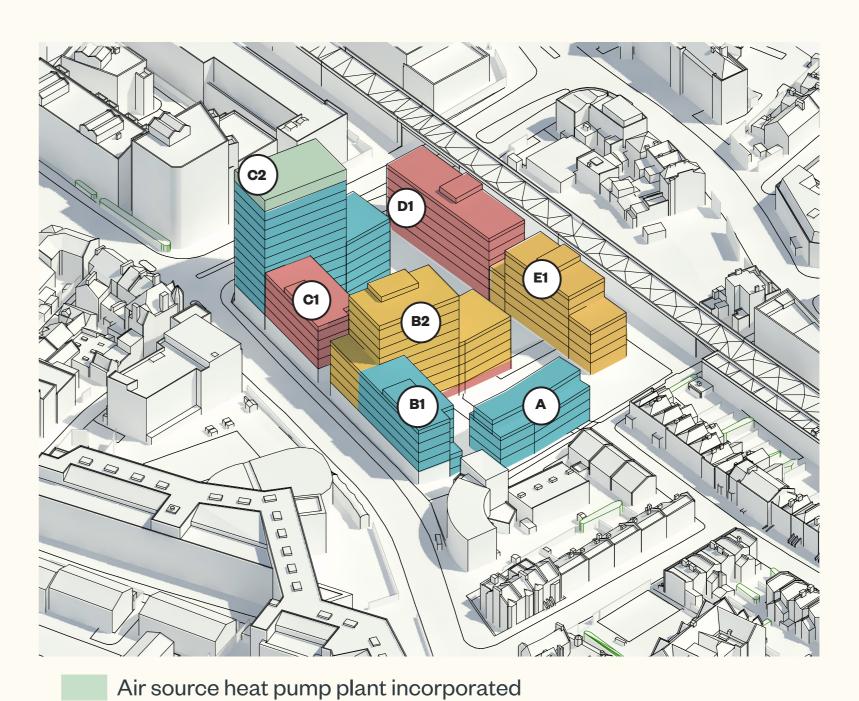

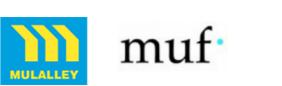
- · 3-5 flats per circulation core (lift / stairshaft)

- · Retention of quality and character of architecture and public realm is paramount
- · The revised scheme aligns as closely as possible to the building footprint and heights of the consented scheme

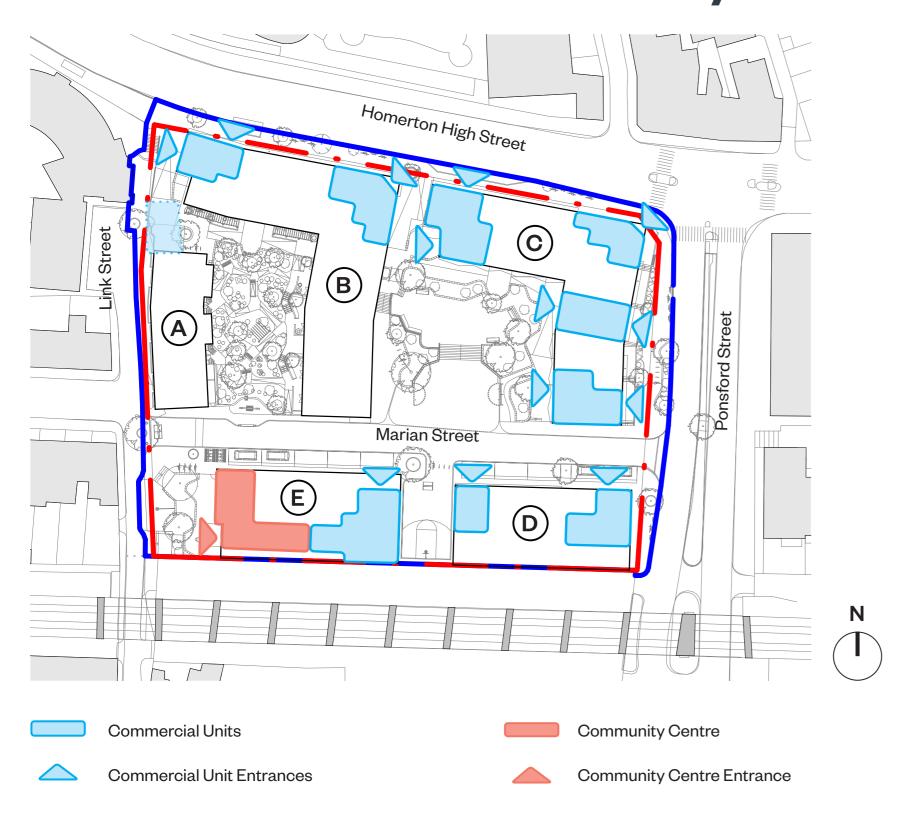
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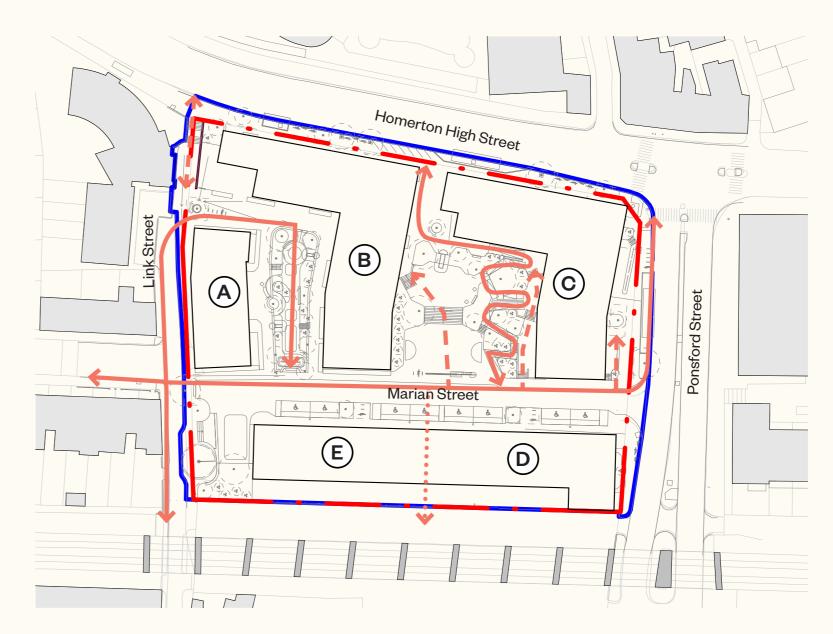
Pedestrian Site Access



Commercial units and community centre

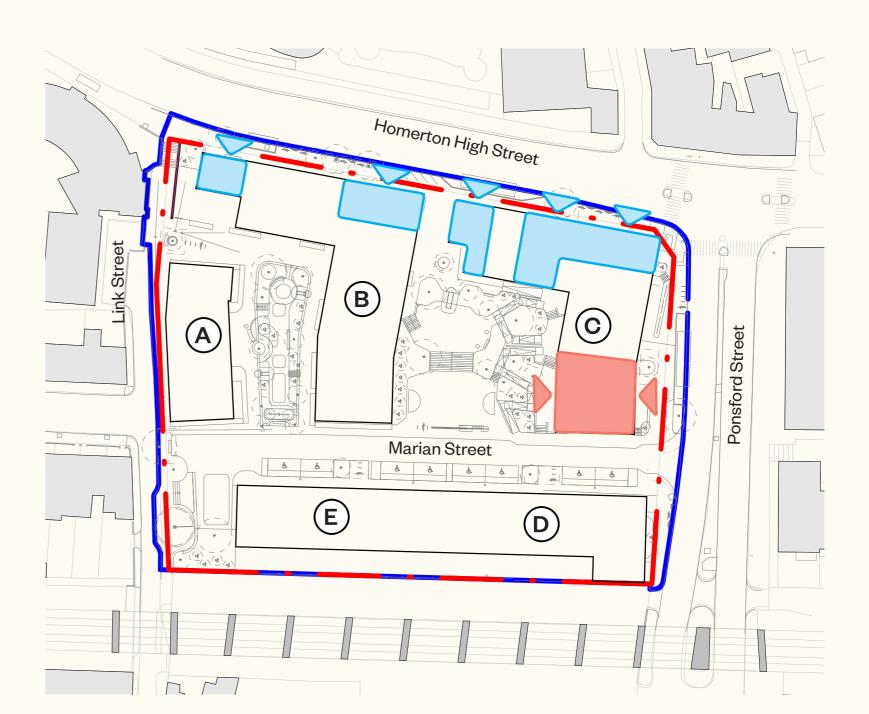


Revised Scheme (163 Homes)



Site access information:

- Omission of the Cascading Gardens to create a lower ground floor in Block B and a level garden courtyard.
- Step free access from Homerton High Street to site via Marian Street retained.
- · Stairs from Homerton High Street to Link Street improved.



Commercial and community centre information:

- Community centre relocated to Block C on Ponsford Street to benefit from street frontage and connection to central courtyard and adjacent Bridge House.
- More priority given to creating new homes with number of commercial units and overall commercial floor area reduced. Marian Street units removed and commercial use focussed on Homerton High Street.





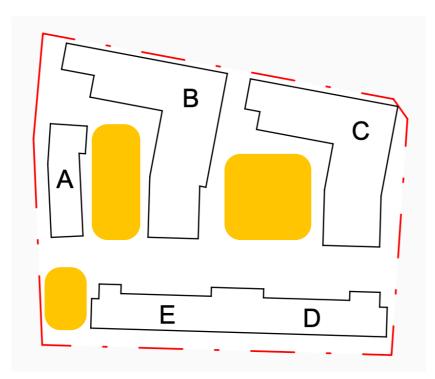


Landscape Proposals

The new street - Marian Street and Marian Lane connect the site across existing green spaces, creating green and quiet cut throughs between schools and local spaces.

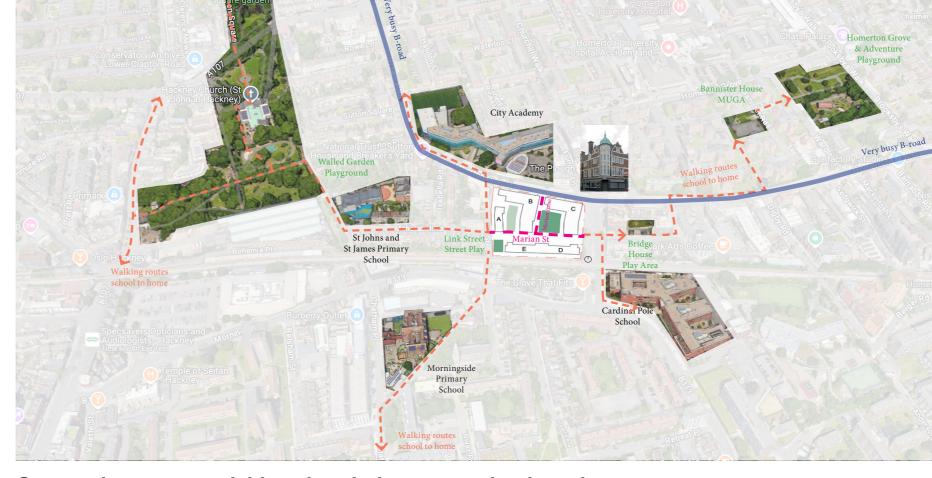
There are three key playable areas:

- Link St Corner
- The Yard
- The Garden



Link Street Corner

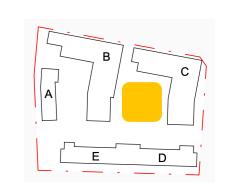
The corner at Link Street will have play-on-the-way in the form of playable rope trails alongside the footpath. A stage provides a place for perforamance and rest as you approach the site.



Connecting across neighbourhoods, between schools and greenspaces

The Yard

The large Eastern public square provides an area for inclusive performative play for all ages, with it's informal stage areas for seating, socialising, and spectating with one large basket swing. The Eastern Yard creates a series of different spaces linked by the ramped step free route which traverses the 4 metre change in level, which is space separating the smaller terraces from ball play in the yard.



A slide offers a short cut to the large terrace while the set of South facing steps offers informal seating looking onto an area big enough for ball games.



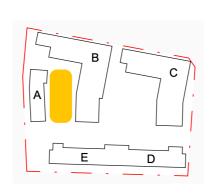

The Garden

The Western Courtyard is designed as a play garden sunken 40 cm below ground level, aimed at the under 7's. It has a play net, seesaw, two slides and a play stage. The Garden also plays a role in sustainable drainage during exceptional rain fall when it can collect water.

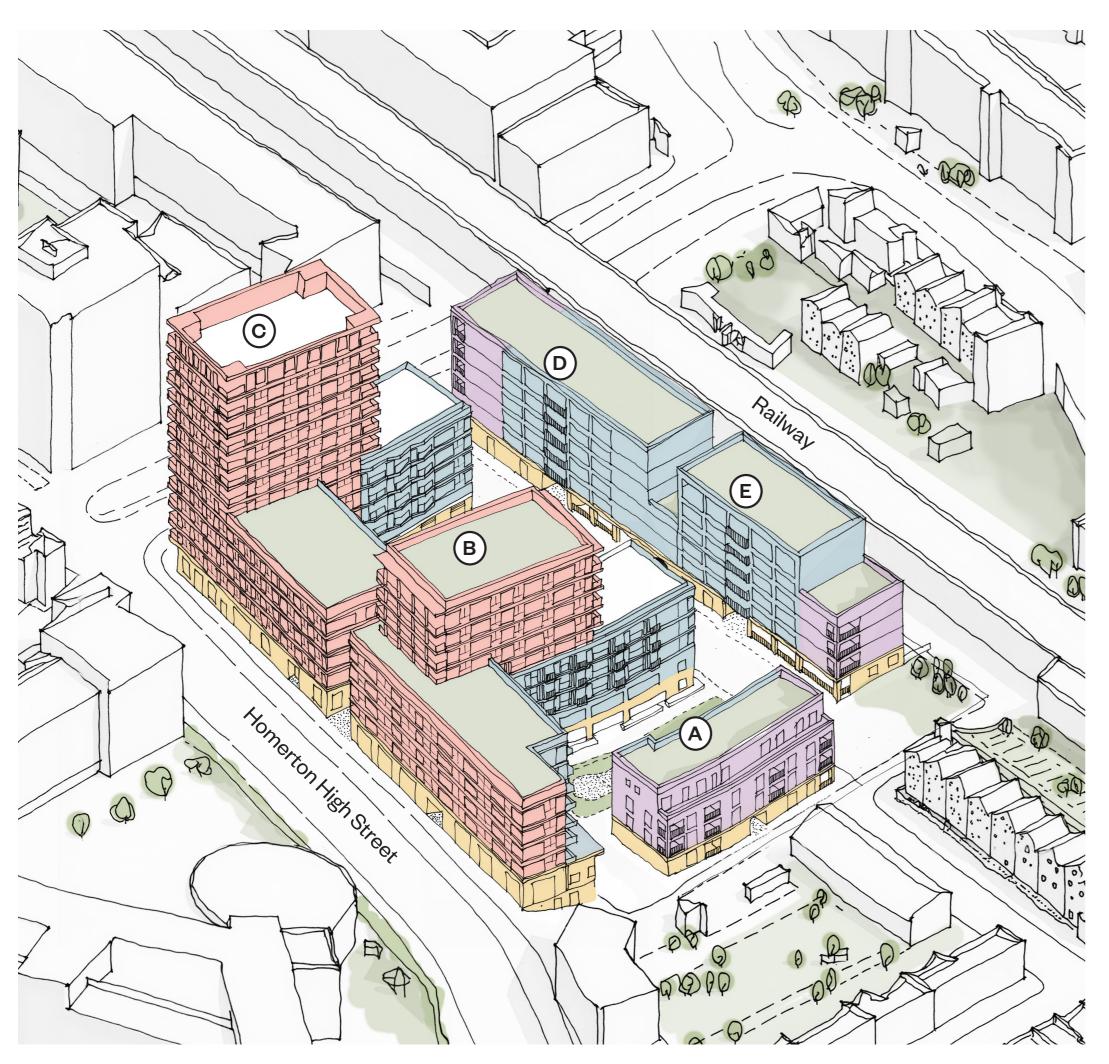

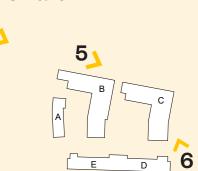

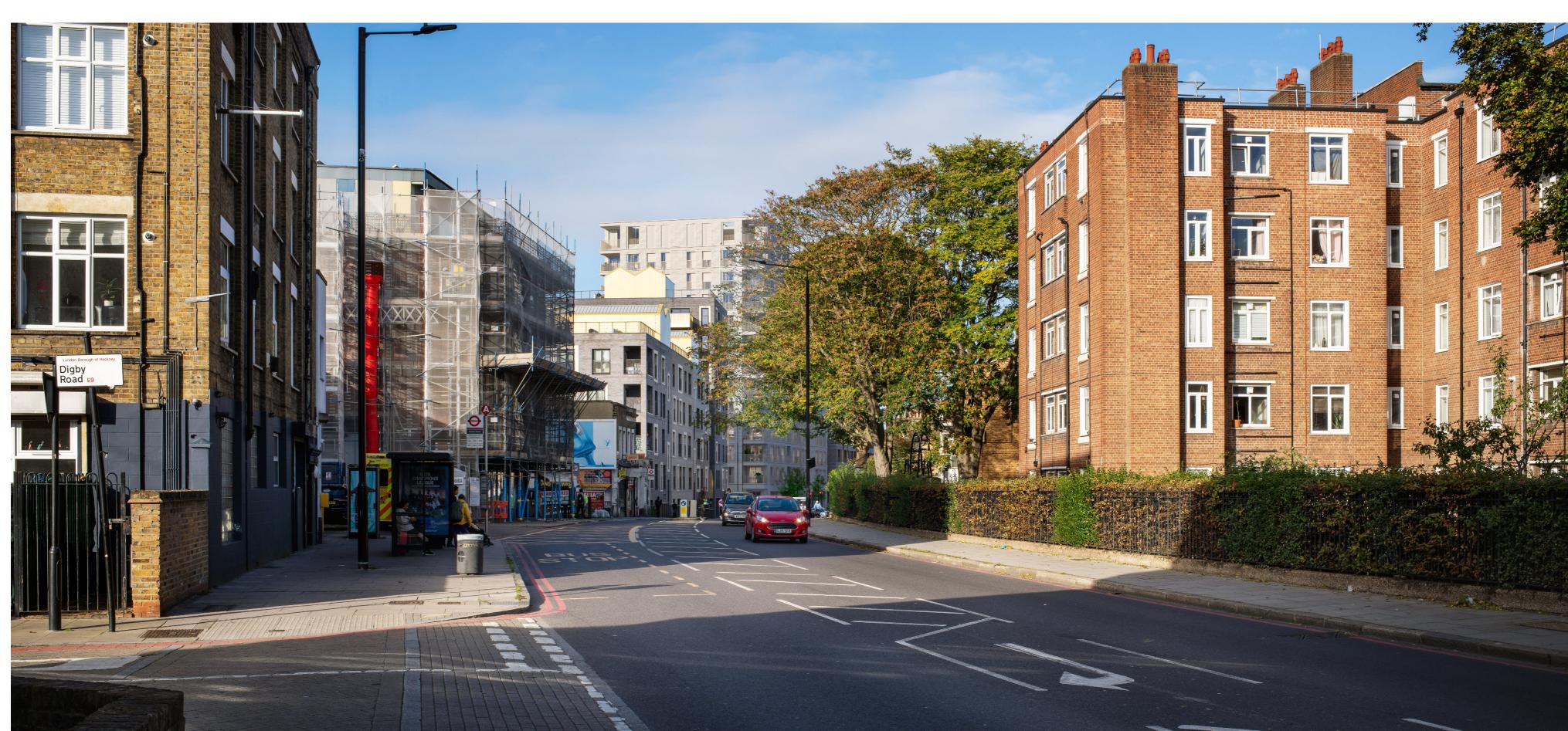
