### Denne Terrace and Dunston Road – Public realm improvements

Following the recent consultation in September and October 2024, plans to implement public realm improvements at Denne Terrace and Dunston Road have been approved.

The decision has taken into consideration the outcome of the public consultation, where residents were able to express their views on the proposals. You can view the consultation document and the detailed decision report with the results of the consultation at:

The Council also consulted with key stakeholders including local ward members and emergency services operators.

The scheme forms part of our plans to create a greener, healthier Hackney, improve road safety and support people to walk, shop and cycle locally.

We will carry out a statutory consultation for the two locations. Notice of the changes will be advertised in the Hackney Citizen and London Gazette on **24 January 2025**.

## What works will be carried out?

### Denne Terrace

The public realm improvements at Denne Terrace will include:

- Making the last 44.5 metres of Denne Terrace towards Queensbridge Road pedestrian and cycles only by installing a restriction for motor vehicles near the footpath to Clemson House.
- In addition, the road will be reduced in width and raised to just below the pavement level to highlight the restriction to motor vehicles.
- Installing wider pavements with trees to improve the walking routes to and from the canal towpath.
- Convert five car parking spaces to cycle parking to extend the existing cycle parking facilities and to include cycle hire.

### Stean Street / Dunston Road junction

The public realm improvements at the Stean Street / Dunston Road junction will include:

- Replacing the two temporary planters with standalone trees and a rain garden (a type of Sustainable Drainage System or SuDS with new trees and low level planting) to enhance the public realm and help improve air quality.
- Installing a kerb build-out with a raised entry table and cycle parking stands at the Stean Street / Dunston Road junction to help highlight further the presence of the traffic filter.
